

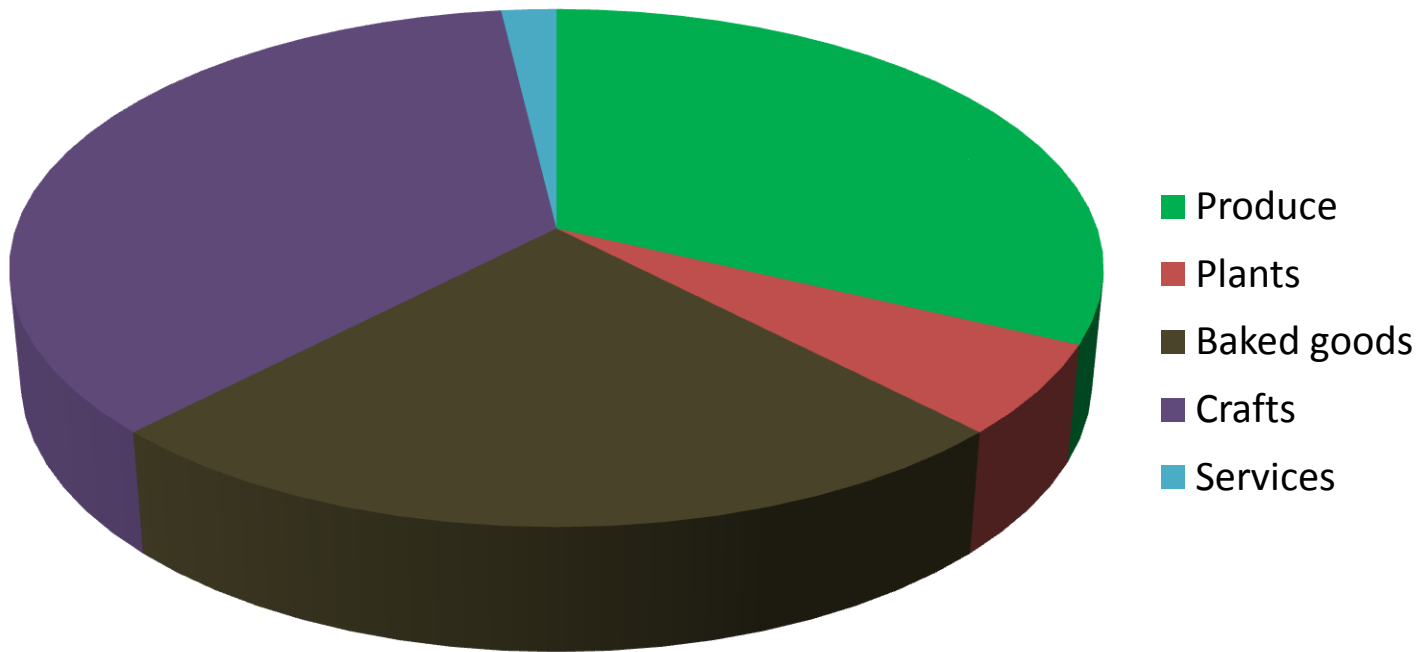
Manchester Farmers Market 2013



2013 Farmers Market

- 19 markets were held
- Averaged 18 vendors per market
- 59 different vendors participated
- Eight vendors attended $\geq 80\%$
- Music/entertainment included in all markets
- Reported gross sales = \$37,854
- Customer coupons + Food pantry = \sim \$2200

Handsown Farms - Produce
